Newly appointed Welsh Secretary David Jones underlined the UK Government's commitment to nuclear power during a visit to the A station earlier this month. Speaking ahead of his visit, Mr Jones said:

"This Government remains firmly committed to its efforts to ensure that the conditions are right for investment in new nuclear power in Wales and the UK as a whole.

"The Horizon site at Wylfa represents an extremely attractive investment opportunity and there remains considerable interest."

Progress since May 2012 (1)

- Significant and essential terrestrial, marine, ecological studies, seismic works and ground water monitoring have continued
- Completed initial topographical surveying along the A5025, enabling us to refine our initial proposals for route improvements
- Taken over the Magnox L&D buildings – refurbished and reopened as Horizon’s site office. In June we welcomed the Energy Minister and Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Wales to the office
- Carried out improvement works to habitable properties on our site to ensure they meet the needs of current and future tenants

Progress since May 2012 (2)

- Identified unsafe empty, boarded up houses - as well as outbuildings, abandoned caravans and barns on our site - that we'd like to remove in the future:
 - submitted 15 notifications to IACC to remove a total of 11 derelict houses or other structures
 - application covering derelict outbuildings at Tre'r Gôf also encompasses the house. However, no plans to remove house and intend to keep it occupied
 - received notification from IACC that work can proceed within a five year period
 - first we must ensure we don't disturb any protected species during removal works and can relocate them
 - signage with Horizon contact details on all empty properties to discourage unauthorised access
 - bulk of any demolition work will take place in 2013 and only after we've shared details with local people
 - Recycling materials and minimising waste will be an integral part of any demolition activities. Wherever possible materials will be reused on site

Progress since May 2012 (3)

- Continued to hold monthly Open Surgeries to field questions and comments from local people
- Hosted a stand at the Anglesey Show for the fourth year running
- Continued to engage with local supply chain. Presentation at Nuclear Industry Association (NIA) and Welsh Government North Wales supply chain event in Llangefni in early September

Current and future work (1)

- Continued local community engagement. Next Open Surgery 1pm – 6.30pm on Monday 15 October at Holyhead Town Hall
- EIA ecological baseline surveys continuing: bat, marine bird, reptile, invertebrates, water vole, otter, hedgehog and water quality and plankton
- Health & Safety related signage to be installed near to the existing station outfall warning of steep cliffs and strong currents
- Continued planning for a swift return to business under new owners



Current and future work (2)

- Continued work to study local infrastructure including further topographical surveys to help us refine our initial proposals for route improvements
- Grid connection remains in place. National Grid's work to strengthen existing transmission network continues, along with public consultation later this year
