PLG Terms of Reference

Structure

- The PLG is a forum for representatives of organisations to discuss issues related to the Wylfa New Build programme
- Representation is limited to one member from each organisation
- Where consensus of opinion is needed, the Chair will organise a vote
- Actions taken relating to matters discussed will be reported back by Horizon
- Members of the public are welcome, but cannot vote

PLG Terms of Reference

Organisation and management

- The PLG will meet at least quarterly at the Learning and Development Centre at Wylfa
- Meetings will usually start at 5.30pm and finish by 7.30pm
- Meetings will be conducted in Welsh with translation provided
- Horizon will manage all secretariat duties

PLG Terms of Reference

Scope

- The PLG's scope will initially cover the following areas:
 - Employment
 - Supply Chain
 - Skills
 - Transport
 - Community benefits & legacy
 - Health, safety and the environment
 - Emergency services

PLG Terms of Reference

The Chair & Vice Chair

- The Chair and Vice Chair will be elected by members
- They will serve for two years
- It is the Chair's responsibility to facilitate meetings and ensure they are impartial and inclusive
- The Chair will not be an employee of Horizon unless it is requested by the group

PLG Chair & Vice Chair Nominations

- One vote per member organisation
- Make a first and second choice selection for each post
- Proxy votes received from those unable to attend
- Votes will be counted and results circulated

Associated Development

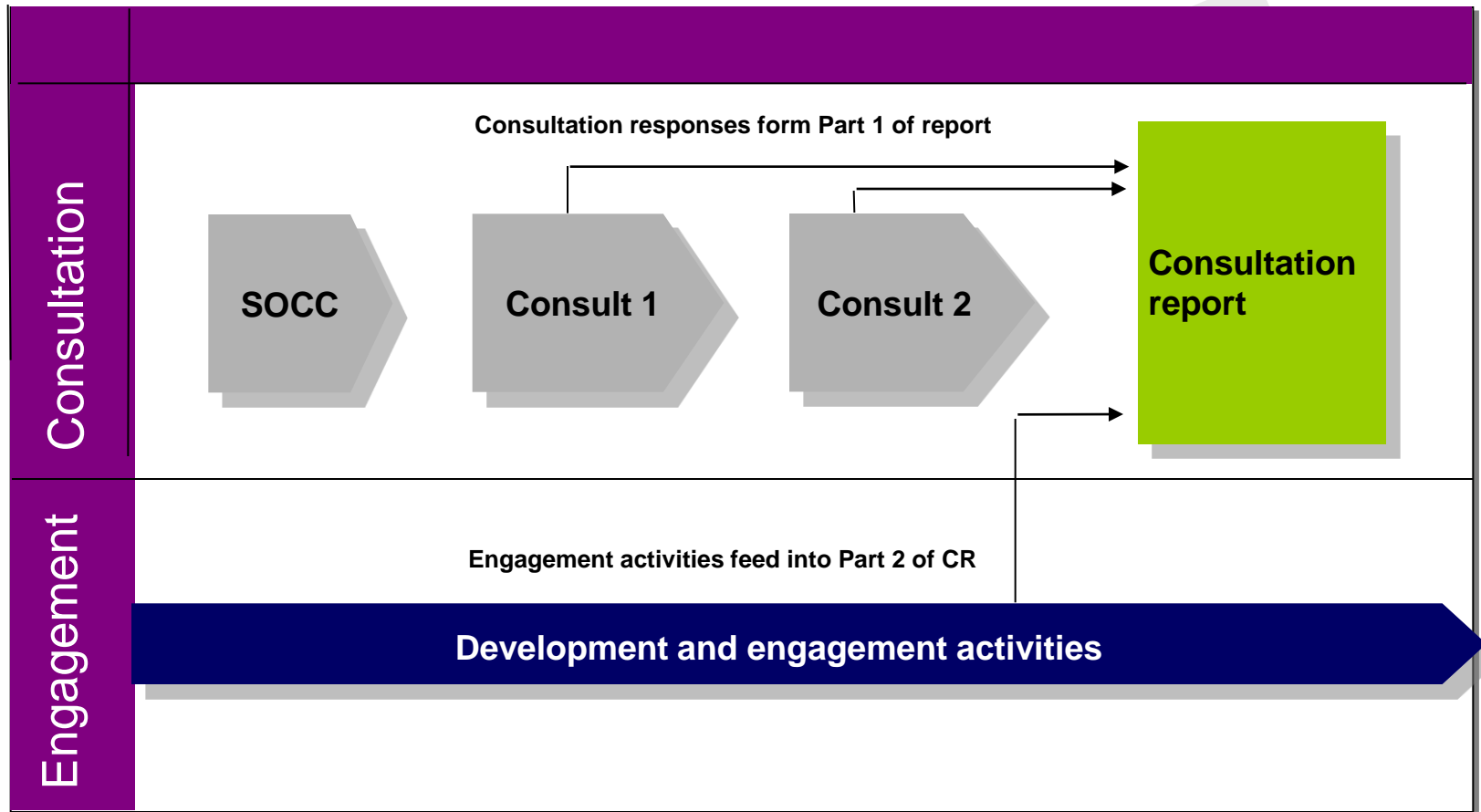
- Traffic and Transport studies
