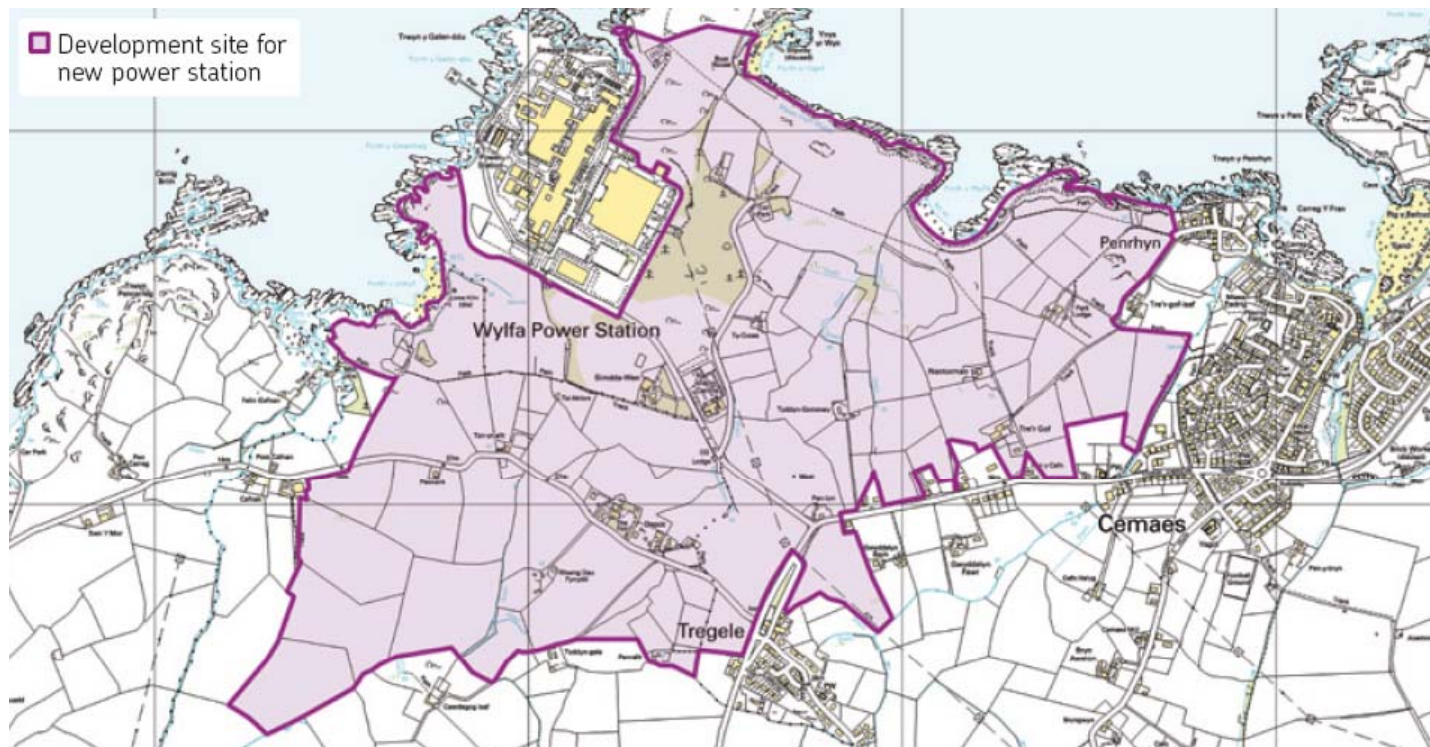

Horizon Nuclear Power

- Formed in January 2009 – a 50:50 joint venture between E.ON UK and RWE npower
- Office opened November 2009
- Safety First culture
- Mission to develop around 6,000MW of new nuclear capacity by 2025. At least £15bn investment.

A PHASED APPROACH



- Horizon aims to develop a new 3,300 MW nuclear power station at Wylfa
- Employment:
 - 800 permanent jobs, rising to 1,000 during maintenance periods
 - Around 5,000 jobs during the construction period
- Studies underway – supporting the planning application
- An opportunity for Anglesey

Engaging and consulting with Anglesey and North Wales

- To date:

 - Business engagement events on Anglesey (December 2009)
 - Monthly drop in sessions in 2010
